Legal Requirement

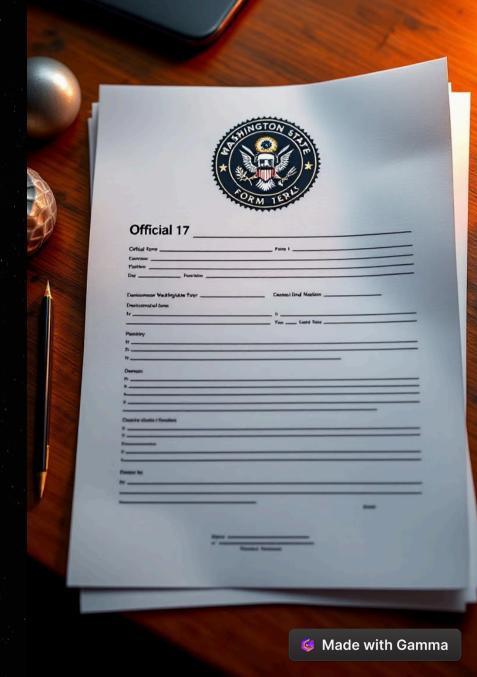
Form 17 is mandated by Washington State law for residential property sales.

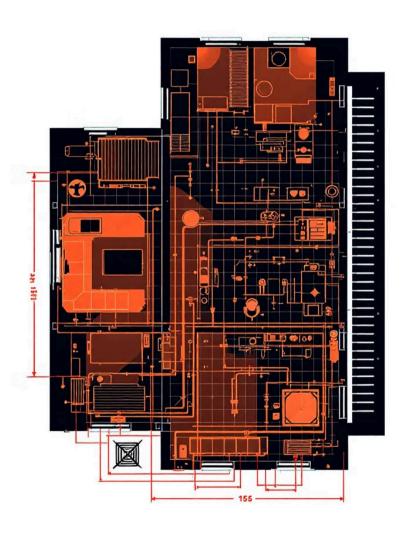
Seller's Responsibility

Past repairs, leaks, or remodeling information.



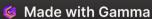
Water and Sewer

Environmental Considerations

Flooding

Disclose any history of flooding or water damage on the property.

Hazardous Materials

Report presence of asbestos, lead-based paint, or other harmful substances.

Nearby Farms

Inform buyers about agricultural activities that may affect the property.



Filling Out Form 17: Best Practices

1 Be Honest

Disclose all known issues about your property to the best of your knowledge.

Be Thorough

Provide detailed information for each section of the form.

Be Timely

Complete and share the form soon after signing a purchase agreement.

Seek Help

Consult with a real estate professional if you're unsure about any section.
